Create a beautiful compilation of your family's ultimate favorite recipes in one spill-proof location! Once you combine your artful inspiration along with your go-to dishes, you'll have an easier time getting dinner on the table. This is a great project gift for a bridal shower or for someone who is changing their eating style and needs to launch with some healthy recipes. Pass along your tried and true favorites in a way they'll never forget!

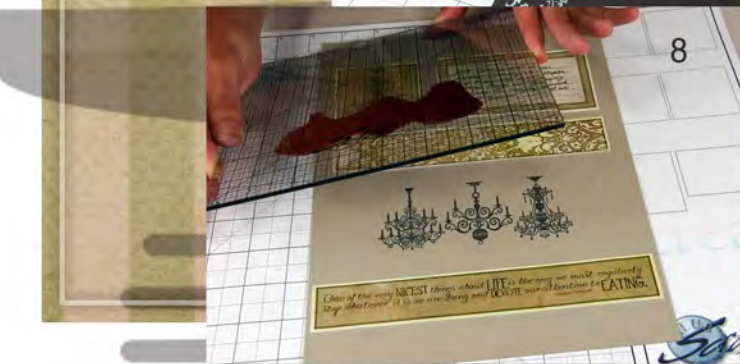
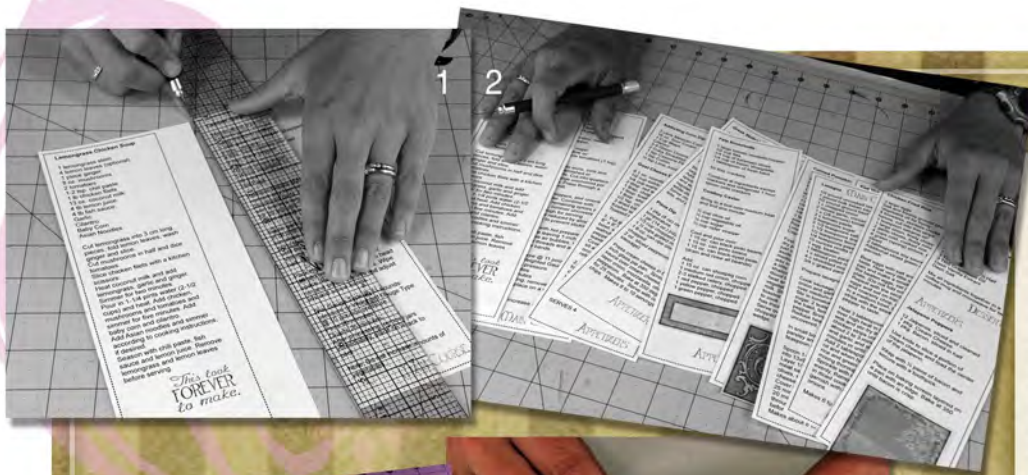
**Project Kit:**

- 8.5x11 Wine, Taupe, Charcoal and White Plains
- 12x12 White Cutapart
- 8.5x11 4-Pocket Clear Menu Cover

**Tools and Materials:**

- CS® Grid Ruler
- CS® Ink Applicator
- Craft Knife and Cutting Mat
- Bon Appétit Unmounted Stamps
- Word Processing Program/Printer
- CS® Earth, India Black and White Pigment Inks
- White Plain





## Preparation:

1. **Use** your favorite word editing program to compile a collection of your favorite recipes. We formatted ours into 3x9" columns and used an easy-to-read 12-point text. Print the recipes and use a craft knife and cutting mat or paper trimmer to reduce to the desired size.
2. **Repeat** step one until all recipes are prepared. Our book houses twelve 3x9" columns.

## Assembly:

1. **Separate** the printed cutaparts into sections as indicated by the artwork. For more precise results, use a ruler and craft knife.
2. **Stamp** a quote or family name onto a sheet of White Plain and trim to fit within the front page cutpart.
3. **Ink** edges of book title with CS® Earth ink and ink applicator and adhere to the front page.
4. **Nest** the front page onto the 8.5x11 Wine Plain.
5. **Attach** two prepared recipe columns to the back of the Wine Plain.
6. **Slide** the page into the front pocket of the menu cover.
7. **Stamp** and decorate both sides of the remaining Charcoal, White, and Taupe papers included in the kit.
8. **Use** any remaining cutouts or stamped image to complete the back page insert.

Think about other fun ways to "kick it up a notch" by adding stitched pages into the binding or installing self adhesive pockets or memory clips to the page protectors. The sky's the limit!
